

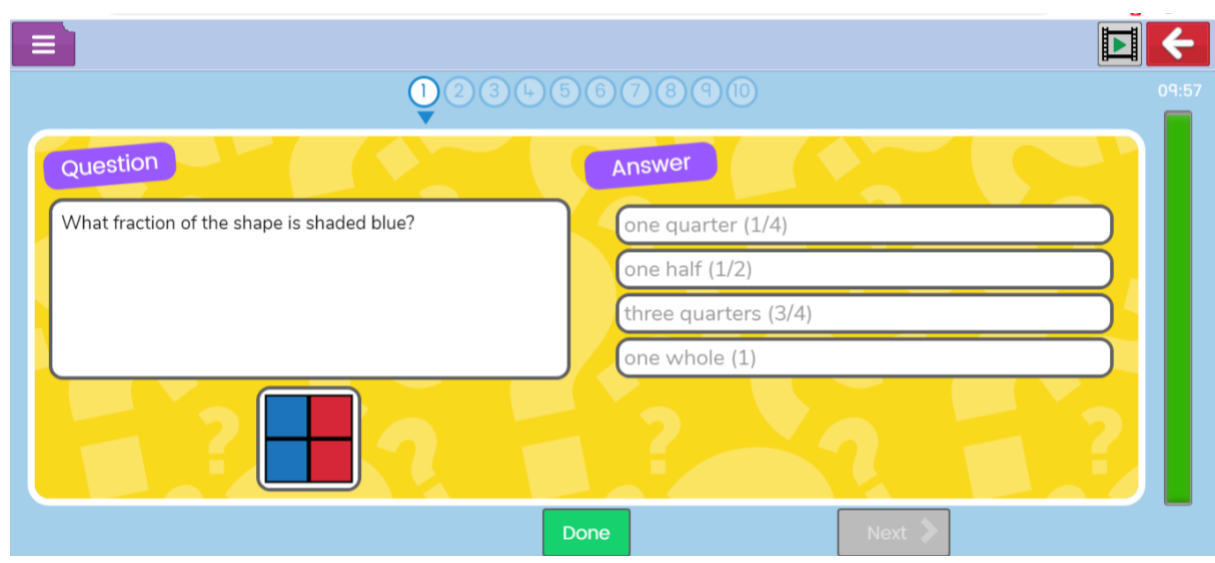
## Purple Mash - How to save

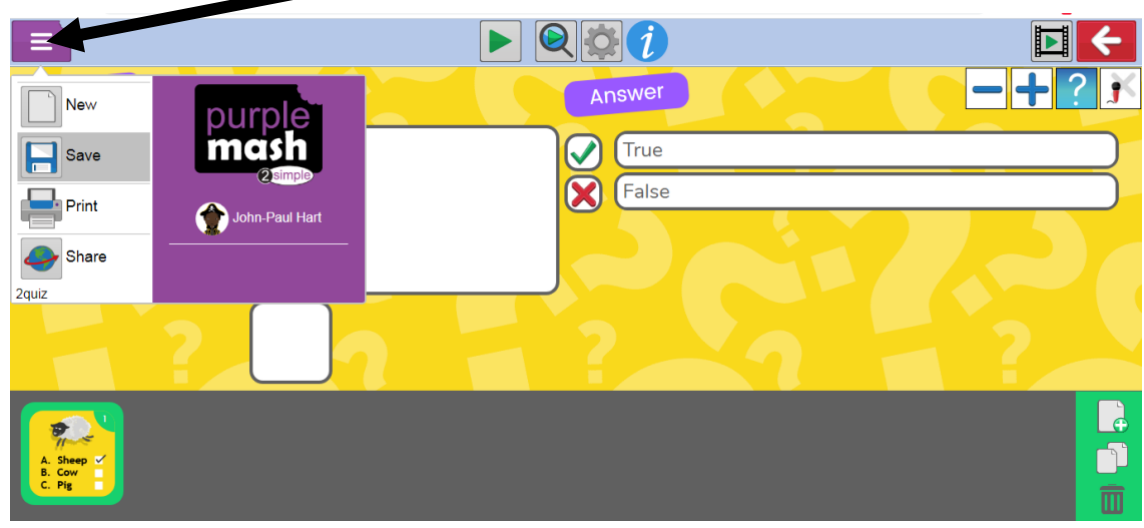

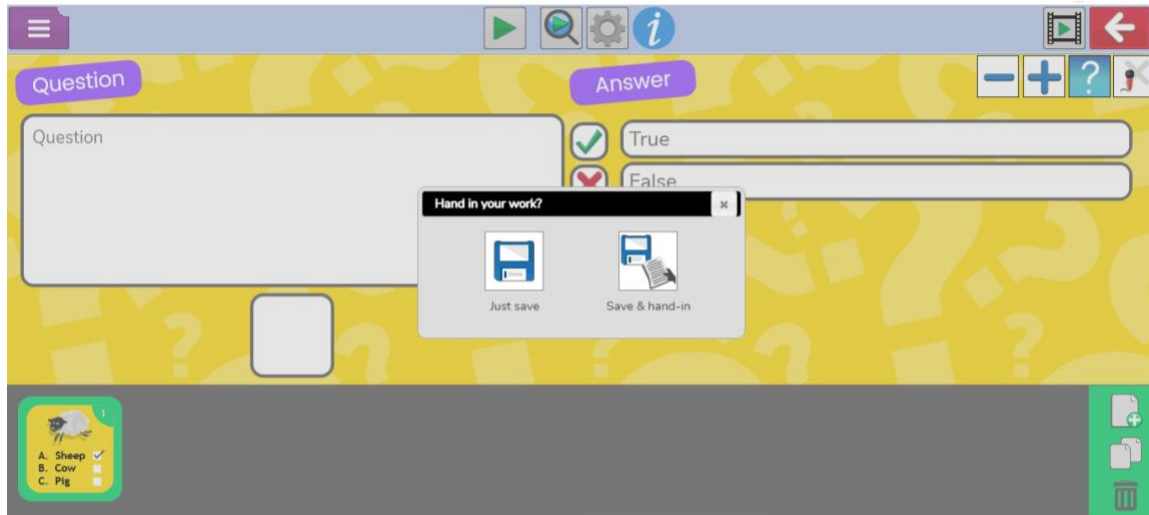

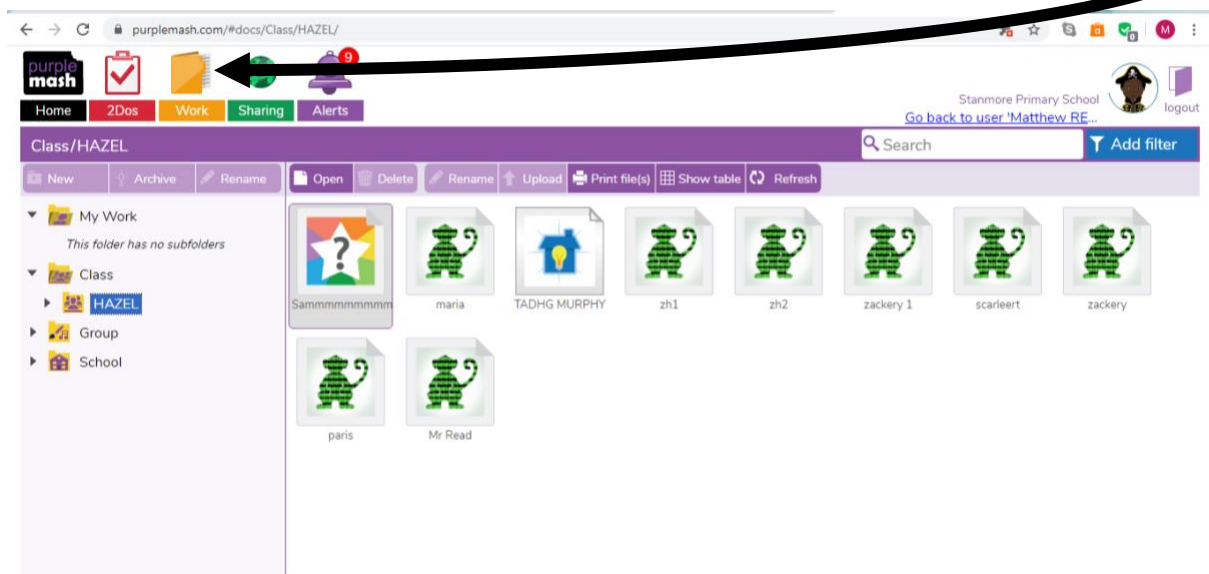
There are some tasks, such as this one below where children had to write a quiz, where you can choose to save your work. There are two ways of doing this. You can either click here where you will have two options.



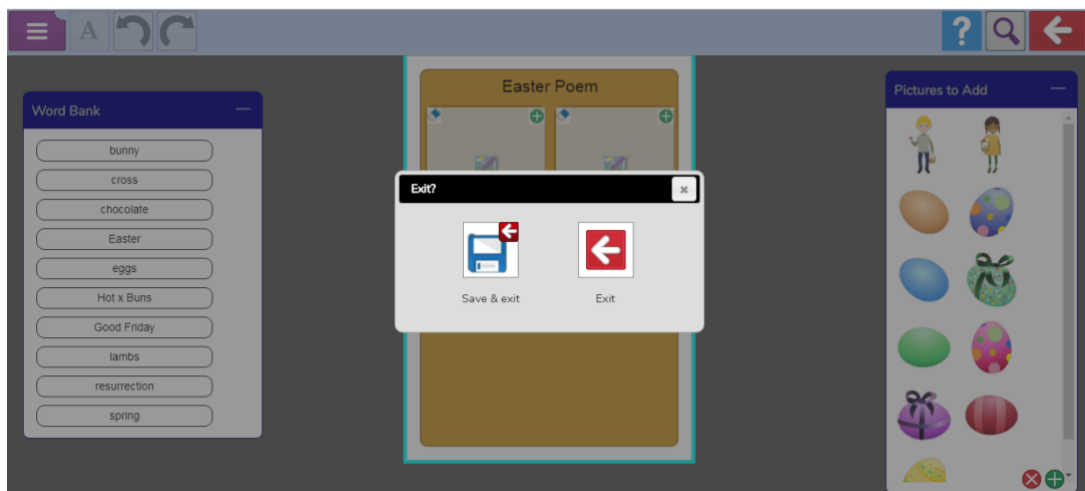
You can either save your work which puts it in your work folder, you would do this if you haven't quite finished yet. Or if you have finished your work then you can hand it in to the teacher.



You get to your work folder by clicking on the orange work folder and then either selecting it from My work folder or your class folder.



The other way you can save your work is by clicking on the red back arrow in the top right and then clicking on save and exit.
